

Beauty in Resistance

Artist Activist Cohort 2023

In the book of Isaiah, we find a prophet who knew the urgency and importance of being connected to God amid rebellion and idolatry. And like most prophets he was not embraced. The book of Isaiah not only points to the coming Messiah, but it calls a nation to reconcile their faulty hearts of worship. To be a creative within the Church is to be faced with the call to be an artist-activist, someone who will stand in the face of injustice and imagine a world that is threaded with the original intent of worship.

The Beauty in Resistance project is an eight-month cohort for young BIPOC creatives (ages 22-30) serving in churches and their vocations. This will be a space that embraces difficult topics of embodied justice, the politicization of the Body, and the rise and fall of celebrity Christianity all while calling participants to just imagine, worship, be, and freely create.

Each month for six months, this cohort will meet virtually and dive deeper into what it truly means to be a leader with prophetic imagination. This cohort will culminate in a four-day, in-person retreat where participants will be invited to encounter God and worship through original creative expression in whatever mediums they choose.

- 6 virtual Sessions (Oct, Nov, Jan, Feb, Mar, May) on the 3rd Wed of the month
- 1 in-person retreat (April)
- Cost: \$500
